



### 3 YEARS OF IMPACT

Health For Nigeria has reached more than 21,000 students in 11 communities across 6 states in Nigeria. In 2023 alone, our services were accessible to a combined population of 12,000 students and staff members.

We have also been able to provide healthcare services to 6,000+ Nigerians since our inception.





### WHAT IS NURSE A SCHOOL (NAS) PROGRAM?

The Nurse-A-School program is a significant initiative for promoting health in Nigeria, providing accessible healthcare services to schools, particularly in underserved rural communities. The program offers healthcare services through direct treatments, counseling, and health education to students and staff in public secondary schools, thereby enhancing their health and knowledge about health and diseases.

Between 2020 and 2023, Health for Nigeria has been dedicated to implementing health-oriented initiatives that have significantly contributed to the overall development, maintenance, and restoration of health among students, staff, and host communities. Our services are accessible to a combined population of 21,000 students and staff members. In 2023, we successfully reached out to various groups within the communities, benefiting approximately 1,000 community members through several community engagement outreaches. Among these, 580 individuals underwent Blood Pressure and Blood Sugar tests for early detection and referral purposes. The School Health Clubs, established in all schools, continue to make a positive impact, with a total attendance of 8,026 recorded.

The program was launched on 19th November 2020 at Bashorun/Ojo High School in Ibadan, Oyo state, Nigeria. Since its inception and launch, the program has been expanding and growing. With the inclusion of the Delta State program, we are now established and operational in 12 schools across six states in Nigeria (Oyo, Ondo, Ekiti, Osun, Delta, and Abuja).

#### **NAS GENERAL REPORT FOR 2023**

- The program is currently running in 11 schools across 6 states (3 in Ondo, 3 in Oyo, 2 in Ekiti, 1 in Abuja, and 1 in Osun state).
- The activities for the school year started January 9, 2023, and ended December 15th, 2023. Students, teaching staff, and non-teaching staff with diverse health complaints were well attended to in the sick bay.
- The total number of sickbay visits for the year was6,400 visits from our 11 sickbays.



### NURSE A SCHOOL PROGRAM

- Assembly health education was done by all the nurses on several topics (COVID 19, malaria, deworming, hand washing, infection control, personal hygiene, etc.).
- Assembly health inspection was regularly conducted by all the nurses where the personal hygiene of the students was assessed (fingernails, socks, school uniform, hair, etc. were inspected for neatness).
- The nurses visited the homes of at least one student with a chronic medical condition or a special case and this opportunity was used to educate the parents on health, as well as provide encouragement.
- All the nurses conducted weekly school health club meetings for the students. The health club has become an avenue to enhance health literacy among the students.
- The School Health Club meetings (SHC) during the terms placed special emphasis on mental health education to reorient the students towards optimal mental wellbeing. These meetings also included demonstrations on cardiopulmonary resuscitation, coping strategies for students with disabilities in schools, improvement of Indoor Air Quality (IAQ) e. t. c.

#### **Community Engagements**



### CHALLENGES FACING THE NURSE-A-SCHOOL PROGRAM

- 1. Absence of visual aids to supplement learning process during school health club meetings.
- 2. Inadequate support from the schoolteachers and principals.
- 3. Nonchalant attitudes of the parents towards the health of their children.
- 4. Lack of reliable electricity supply for the nurses in the rural communities.

The train-the-trainer session for the Health for Nigeria (HFN) nurses on Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) skills was conducted by Prof. Elsie Jolade, Clinical Professor and Graduate Coordinator, Adult-Gerontology Clinical Nurse Specialist Program at Hunter-Bellevue School of Nursing, New York.

The workshop was conducted at St. Monica's Girls Grammar School on 4t July 4<sup>th</sup>, 2023. Staff members of the school and school prefects were also educated on the importance of CPR skills in emergency situations. Mr. Fred & Prof. Elsie Jolade donated a CPR mannequin to HFN and promised to continue supporting our work.
