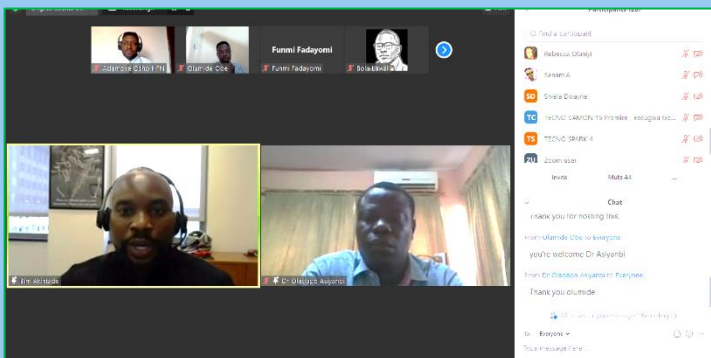

HFN MONTHLY LECTURE SERIES Communicating For Impact and Development

On the 20th of October 2021, Health For Nigeria (HFN) hosted the sixth installment of its monthly lecture series. This time, we were joined by our guest lecturer Dr. Oladapo Asinyabi, a public health physician practicing as the Head of the Public Health Department in Lagos State. The topic involved COVID 19, and dispelling the



myths and misconceptions around the disease, its treatment, and the COVID-19 vaccine administration. There were many heated discussions as we were joined by Nigerian and international healthcare professionals, each with their unique opinions and experiences with the COVID19 pandemic. - November Lecture – Nurse Practitioners: An Opportunity to bridge the Healthcare Gap in Nigeria.

This month will feature a lecture on bridging the healthcare gap utilizing nurse practitioners (NPs). NPs are a level of advanced practice registered nurses, utilized in some developed countries, who serve at a higher level than registered nurses (RNs). NPs are trained to assess patient needs, order and interpret diagnostic and laboratory tests, diagnose disease, and formulate and prescribe treatment plans. We believe that there is an opportunity for Nigeria to bridge the medical brain drain occurring by creating advanced practice tracks for nurses to take on higher level roles in hospitals and throughout Nigeria’s health system.



We will be joined by Dr. Shannon Idzik who is the Associate Dean for the Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) Program at the University of Maryland School of Nursing. She

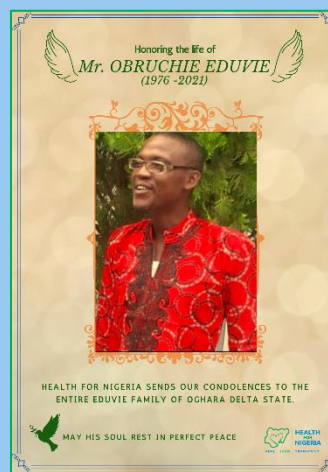
will provide us with insights on what advanced practice nurses do, how they are trained, and their role in the health systems where they are being utilized. Ultimately, we hope to begin discussions on establishing and training nurses towards advanced practice roles in Nigeria.

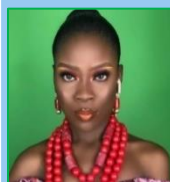
HFN UPCOMING INITIATIVES CONTD.

The goal is to raise ₦1,475,000 to supplement the ₦525,000 balance of the ₦1,075,000 that was raised by family and friends. All the funds raised will be used to establish “The Obruchie Eduvie Nurse A School Sickbay,” and hire A full time registered nurse in a rural public secondary school in Delta state. The sickbay will be commissioned in honor of Mr. Eduvie.

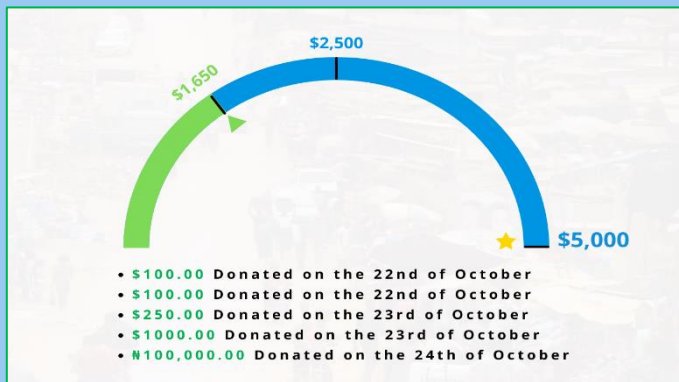
