#### NURSE A SCHOOL ACTIVITIES

Health education regarding food hygiene is an



important component
of ensuring safety and
well being of the
students consuming
meals prepared in
school kitchens. By
providing education
about personal hygiene,
safe food preparation
and storage, cooking

practices, cleaning and sanitizing procedures, and allergen awareness, school cooks can significantly reduce the risk of foodborne illnesses in school aged children.

Recently several public schools experienced a preventable yet potentially serious Diphtheria outbreak. HFN nurses were aware and met to get updated information related to the prevention and management of Diphtheria. This strategy



helped ensure delivering accurate information, addressing concerns, and promoting vaccination and preventive measures.

Across HFN schools, nurses educated both staff and students about common symptoms, which include sore throat, fever, difficult swallowing and a thick coating on the throat or tonsils. Nurses also

highlighted the importance of seeking medical attention if these symptoms occur. They also emphasized the value of immunization as the most effective way to prevent



diphtheria and encouraged individuals to ensure their vaccination status is up to date.
