Children are inherently more vulnerable to many toxic environmental pollutants than adults. Our Nurses are doing a great job in their various locations to ensure both the

students and staff stay healthy as well as empower them to make healthier decisions as they grow.



As sexual abuse of female children and adolescent pregnancy has gained increasingly widespread public recognition in our society, the relationship between early abuse and teenage pregnancy also has become a focus of attention. Nurse Abidoye Abimbola in Ekunle High School 1, meet with all the school female students to educate them on **Sexual Abuse, Teenage pregnancy and its negative effects.**

He engaged the students on **mental health and stigmatization.** Reducing the stigma surrounding mental health in schools is important to both the students in the classroom, but also, the wider school community. Schools play a vital role in addressing mental health-based stigma as young people with mental health problems are more likely to experience higher levels of stigma than adults. Our nurses help students understand what they can and cannot control.


