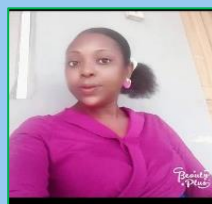
Seyifunmi Adebayo, RN

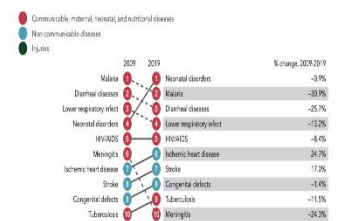
MONTHLY WORKSHOP TRAINING FOR HFN NURSES

On the 28th of April 2023, Health for Nigeria (HFN) hosted its monthly workshop training for the Nurse A School Program nurses in partnership with Food and Care for All (FCFA). **Dr. Oluwatosin Olateju** presented two MPH candidates from the University of Maryland School of Medicine, concentrating on Global Health. **Ms. Angela Bbosa** delivered her presentation on “Sanitation and Hygiene Management”.

DID YOU KNOW?

The consequences of poor sanitation can be severe. Every year, over 800,000 people die from diarrhea caused by poor sanitation and hygiene practices.

Also, **Ms. Morayo Owolabi** delivered her presentation on “HIV Prevention through youth Education” where we discussed stages of HIV progression, social determinant of Health, HIV & Nigerian youth.

It was an awesome and timely presentation as always.

Know Your Status: Get Tested!

If you are sexually active, you should get tested yearly

HIV Tests look for HIV antibodies in your body. If you have the antibodies, your test results will be positive. Negative test results indicate that you either do not have the antibodies or the antibodies have not been detected yet.

It takes 2-8 weeks after infection for your body to make HIV antibodies. In rare cases, it may take longer.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENTS

This month we are highlighting the various efforts HFN has made through the Nurse A School (NAS) program to impact communities across partnering states. HFN nurses conduct health awareness education and promotion activities in their host communities to improve outcomes.



At Ekunle High School 1&2 in Iseyin, Oyo State, Nurse Salami and Nurse Abidoje visited the monthly meeting of the Nigeria Union Of Tailors, Oja Agbe Zone, Iseyin, Oyo State and educated them on **Diabetes Mellitus and Hypertension**.

They were also educated on the importance of regular health check-ups and healthy living. A lot of questions were asked and answered, and misconceptions were cleared accordingly. Free health screenings were conducted including BP, FBS and RBS. People with high readings were referred to the PHC for proper management.



In Ibadan, Oyo State, Nurse Ige Victoria made home visitations over the holiday. She provided education and awareness to residents of their host communities on

environmental sanitization and checking of blood pressure and blood sugar levels. She also provided basic health screening which included blood pressure and blood glucose measurements.



COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENTS



Nurse Ochigbo Grace carried out community engagement exercises in two different villages at Kuje Area Council, Abuja. She visited Danfara PHC to meet with nursing mothers during immunization. 30 mothers were educated on the importance of various health checks, also house to house sensitization on good healthy living, and proper nutrition was conducted. Over 25 persons had their BP and blood sugar levels checked.



In Iresi Osun State, Nurse Adekeye visited the market area and provided health education on hypertension, causes, complications, and its preventive measures. She had a case of a woman with a reading of 160/90mmHg, she was referred to PHC for proper



management.



Nurse Adebayo and Nurse Eniafe in Ondo State visited Redeemed Christian Church of God, Jesus Court Parish Ondo. They provided education and awareness on **hypertension**, also basic health screening was carried out, questions

were asked by the people which was answered accordingly.
